Description:

The Bassler Haynes Buildings, built in 1876, consists of two adjoining buildings and is currently listed on the California Register of Historic Places. They were once used as a hotel and were later remodeled in the Art Moderne style of architecture in 1936. The buildings were damaged by the Loma Prieta earthquake in 1989. They were deemed unsafe for occupancy and boarded up.

In 2004, as part the San Jose Redevelopment Agency's effort to restore historic buildings, the Redevelopment Agency Board approved an Owner Participation and Loan Agreement with Isis Properties, LLC. The buildings were rehabilitated to preserve its historic features and to seismically upgrade the mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems.

The Building's rehabilitation project preserves the City's historical infrastructure and helps to enliven the downtown's historic district by providing additional retail and office space.

- 19,000 square-feet of retail and office space
- Historic windows and fire escapes
- Decorative exterior details on ground floor
- New storefront doors and windows
- New roof
