Project: HP Pavilion

Description: HP Pavilion, composed of glass and steel, has a striking and unique appearance and incorporates a “strip” of graphic elements into a pyramid shaped building. This multi-use facility provides a first-class, large-scale venue for a diversity of functions including sports events and musical performances.

Location: 525 West Santa Clara Street (at Autumn Street)

Benefit: HP Pavilion has attracted nation-wide attention to San Jose as host to high profile entertainers such as Barbara Streisand and The Three Tenors. Downtown restaurants and businesses experience increased foot traffic before and after each event. The popular Sharks ice hockey team, which plays at the Arena, has developed an enthusiastic fan base and has fostered civic pride.

Features:

- 450,000 square feet
- 20,000 maximum seating capacity; 18,000 for ice hockey games; and 19,400 for basketball games.
- 1,800 to 2,100 parking spaces (1,640 on site)
- 65 executive suites
- On-site restaurant
- 12 permanent concession locations plus 12 portable stands throughout the Concourse
- Five men’s and five women’s restrooms

\$135 million from San Jose Redevelopment Agency
\$30 million from San Jose Arena Management Corporation
